VISA

Nationals of most countries do not require a visa prior to traveling to Mauritius, e.g commonwealth countries, European Union. A visa, tourist or business, is normally given for 2 months. The visitor should hold a passport with a minimum validity of 6 months, a valid return ticket and sufficient funds to meet the costs of stay in Mauritius.

In the event an exhibitor is from a country where visa is required then, he/she may apply for a visa at a Mauritian embassy or consulate. If there is no embassy or consulate in the country in question, he/she may apply at the nearest embassy or at any Air Mauritius office. If there is no Air Mauritius office, then application should be sent directly to the Passport and Immigration Office in Mauritius by post/fax. Adze Events can provide assistance

VACCINATIONS

Mauritius is not susceptible to malaria or yellow fever. However, a yellow fever vaccination certificate is required for visitors over the age of 1 year, arriving from areas where yellow fever occurs.

TIME DIFFERENCE

Mauritius is in a single time zone and is four hours ahead of GMT and two hours ahead of Central Africa time (S.A).



BANKS AND MONEY

The currency unit is the Mauritian Rupee, denoted by the 'Rs' symbol, which is made up of 100 cents. Foreign currency can be exchanged at local banks and Bureau de Changes. Most international credit cards such as American Express, Diners Club, Mastercard, Visa and their affiliates are widely accepted. Additionally, Bureau de Changes are available within the Airport premises for the convenience of the international traveller, as well as at most hotels and tourist centres.

Banks are open Monday – Thursday from 9.15am to 15.15pm, Friday from 9.15am - 15.30pm, Saturday from 9.15am - 11.15am (Not all banks). Sunday is a bank holiday.

SHOPPING

Most major shopping centres and malls operate six days a week (Mo-Sat), although some shops and supermarkets do not operate on Sundays beyond 2pm.

HOSPITAL AND MEDICAL CARE

Mauritius offers world-class medical facilities with a strong network of public and private hospitals providing excellent service. If you need any assistance, please contact a member of ADZE EVENTS, who will direct you to the facility.

TAX

Value-added tax (VAT) of 15% is payable on goods and services including hotel and restaurant bills.

PERSONAL SAFETY

Mauritius is generally as safe as any other destination in the world.

ELECTRICITY

The electricity supply across Mauritius is 220 volts AC 50 Hz. The plug is a UK type 3 pin square plug. Adaptors for international appliances are available. It is advisable to bring an appropriate adaptor with you.

CLIMATE

The temperature on the coastal areas varies between 22°C in winter and 34°C in summer. In the central part of the island, the daytime temperature varies from about 19°C in August to about 26°C in February. The western and northern regions are warmer and relatively drier than the east and south.

DRIVING

Driving is on the left side of the road and give way to the right. Foreign visitors with a valid driver's licence issued by a competent authority in their country of origin may drive during their stay in Mauritius.



TOURS AND EXCURSIONS

There are a variety of post-event tours and excursions available to ADZE EVENTS participants.
